









You Count. Your Community Counts.

Every person is special in their own ways and important to their community. **What is a community?** It is a group of people living or working together in the same area. People in communities might go to the same school, shop in the same stores and do the same things. They also help each other and solve problems together. If it's a bigger community, the people might not go to the same places, but they might

like or believe in the same things.

In a way, bees and ants are a community. They live and work together, and solve problems by working together. Many animals live in their own kind of communities.

usually live together and do a lot of the same things. What do you do to help your family at home?

Then there are your friends. They are a community too. They share your ideas and probably go to the same school. Name two friends that go to your school:


Your neighborhood is a community...your town or city is a community in your state. What is the name of the city and state you live in?

Yes, and we are all part of it! Together, we can help each other and work together to solve problems. How can you help your community?




The Community Tree

In the United States, a census is taken every ten years, where every person living in the country—citizens and noncitizens, young and old, workers and non workers—is counted. The government uses census counts to decide how to spend money for schools, playgrounds, roads, hospitals, housing and other things. For each person NOT counted in Marin County, our community loses out. Be sure you are counted because **YOU COUNT**!






Find The Census Form!




